

TE AWAMUTU PRIMARY SCHOOL

ENROLMENT SCHEME

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below* (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

** Commence at the intersection of Jary Road and Ohaupo Road (SH3) and travel south down SH3 to Ngaroto Road. Turn right into Ngaroto Road and continue to the intersection of Ngaroto Road and Paterangi Road. Turn right into Paterangi Road travelling west to the Bowman Road/Paterangi Road intersection (includes Bank Road). Travel south along Bowman Road into Mangapiko School Road, into Hawthorn Road and continue to the Hawthorn Road/Johnson Road intersection (excludes Johnson Road). Continue along Hawthorn Road travelling southwest to Frontier Road and across to Papesch Road.*

Travel along Papesch Road to its end, then a direct line south-east to Ray Road. Travel along Ray Road into Budden Road and follow Budden Road to the intersection with Pokuru Road. Turn left into Pokuru Road and travel to No 358 Pokuru Road, then take a direct line east to No 132 St Ledger Road. Travel north along St Ledger Road to the intersection with Kihikihi Road/Golf Roads (includes side roads, then along Golf Road to the intersection with Park Road.

Turn left at Park Road and travel to the intersection with Albert Park Drive (includes Domain Road). Turn right into Albert Park Drive and travel to the roundabout connecting to Ohaupo Road (SH3) and Cambridge Road. Turn right into Cambridge Road and then left into Te Rahu Road. Travel along Te Rahu Road and into Muir Road, following Muir Road to its end. From the end of Muir Road take a direct line west to where the zone boundary commenced at the intersection of Jary Road and Ohaupo Road (SH3).

(Both sides of all streets and roads are included unless otherwise stated).

Proof of residence within the home zone may be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.



Out of zone enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.

Second Priority must be given to any applicant who is the sibling of a current student of the school.

Third Priority must be given to any student who is the sibling of a former student of the school.

Fourth Priority must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.

Fifth Priority must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school, or a child of a member of the board of the school.

Sixth Priority must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group must be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
