Boards are also responsible for overseeing, with the Principal, the management of personnel, curriculum, property, finance and administration.

TAPS Enrolment Scheme 2010 and what you need to know:

Note: All students who are currently on the roll at TAPS are not affected by this scheme.

Due to the growing roll here at Te Awamutu Primary School the BOT (Board of Trustees), in order to avoid overcrowding, or the likelihood of overcrowding, has adopted an enrolment scheme which has been approved by the MOE (Ministry of Education) ready for implementation in Term 2, 2010.

Under the scheme, students can be enrolled if they live within the home zone as determined by the BOT and MOE. The enrolment of out of zone students is governed by the provisions of the Education Act 1989 and prioritised as listed below.

The criteria for enrolment will be as set out by MOE guidelines and prioritised as listed below;

1. Siblings of current students;
2. Siblings of former students;
3. Children of Board employees (staff);
4. All other students

Selections within these priority groupings will be via ballot next year. The zoning map is included in this newsletter.

Building Renovations/New Classrooms:

Building started this week in our library. This is being converted into two classroom spaces to accommodate the roll growth. A new library will be built in 2010 along with one new classroom being built in the top block area. We will also be erecting a new caretakers shed in the early part of Term 1 to accommodate the growing need for storage and equipment.

ERO (Education Review Office) visit March 2010:

ERO are about reviewing and reporting publicly on the quality of education in all New Zealand schools and they report to individual boards of trustees on what they are doing well and where they need to improve.
