I would like to acknowledge the fabulous work that has taken place this term and all the extremely hard work that parents, teachers and children have put into getting ready for our Show Case presentations. We hope you enjoyed our work and the opportunity to live the learning that the children are a part of here at school. Remember that as a learning community we are all a part of the story and we (as parents) should be starting to fit into each term's chapter as your son, or daughter piece their learning together.

Our show case sharing starts this week with Syndicates 2 and 3 then Syndicates 1 and 4 next week. You are all welcome to come and share with your syndicate's learning.

Syndicate 1 are inviting you to share in their journey as children discuss how to care for our natural environment with a focus on bush life and birds. 1.30 - 5.30 pm Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> June.

Syndicate 2 starts at 1.30pm this Friday. You are all welcome to the area outside Rooms 5, 6, 7 and 8 where the presentations will begin. If it is wet please make your way to the hall. Syndicate 2 will share with us the care and concern they have shown towards the birds in our community by making bird feeders. Classrooms will be open for you to visit.

Syndicate 3 also start their show case this Thursday with the Mayor, Allan Livingston opening the day and the school gully planting project (the gully is at the very rear of the school playing field). I would like to thank Mr Chris Parkes for his support of Syndicates 3's venture – "Restoring our Gully" and planting their very own "Vegetable Valley".

Syndicate 4 will be holding their showcase on Wednesday 1 July between 2 and 3pm and also between 6 and 7pm. Come along and see a visual presentation of all of the amazing things the Syndicate 4 students have been up to this term and check out our classrooms that have been the busy hives of learning this term. Can I encourage all the fabulous work that families are putting into the PTA spellathon fundraiser. The funds raised will go towards all classrooms' wish list items. Our next PTA fundraiser will be the Golden Circle Fun Run. This activity will take place in week 4 of next term and will be run in conjunction with the school X-country.
