## Greatest number to 100

## Purpose:

The purpose of this activity is to help your child practice ordering numbers to 100.

## Link to the Number Framework:

Number Sequence, Stage 4

## What you need:

Playing cards. (Ace = 1, Jack = 0)

## What to do:

The cards are placed faced down in a pile between the players.
Each player selects two cards and arranges them to make the largest two digit number. For example 5 and 2 can be arranged as 52 or 25 .
Ask your child to read the numbers and decide which is biggest.
The cards are placed at the bottom of the pile.
The player with the largest number wins a point. The winner is the first player to win 5 points.

## What to expect your child to do:

- To read the two digit numbers and recognize the biggest number.


## Variation:

The aim can be to make the smallest two digit number.
Ask your child: How many tens are in each number?
Which number is closest to 50 ?
