Dear Parents and caregivers

14 June 2022

I do hope everyone enjoyed a lovely long weekend to celebrate the Queen's 70th Jubilee. Next week, New Zealand will hold it's very first Matariki public holiday, in honour of the Māori New Year. This is "a time where people, whānau, and communities gather together to remember the year that has passed, to celebrate the present, and to plan for the next year. It is a time to reflect on our loved ones who are no longer with us, to feast and celebrate with our relatives and friends, and to look towards the future and the hope of a season full of bounty." (tepapa.govt.nz webpage). The date to put on your calendars is **Friday 24th June**, there is no school on this day.

Whilst we have always prided ourselves on being a safe physical environment, TAPS has developed and improved its Health and Safety notification processes over the past year and a half. Chris Rennie is delegated with the responsibility of identifying and planning for the mitigation of day to day risks across the site and then briefing the Principal and the Board. This year we are using an app called "Safe 365" to record potential risks and near misses and all staff have it loaded on their phones. We invite you, as parents and visitors, to share any risks you see around the school environment, or any near misses you may witness. You can do this by sharing it with any staff member who can record it on our system. Thank you for your help in this.

Teachers in our school will be attending paid union meetings in the week of June 13th in the run up to the re-negotiation of their collective agreement. The meetings will discuss the teachers' Time 4 Tamariki | Wāwāhi Tahā campaign, which aims to win smaller class sizes, more support for high needs students, better recognition of cultural skills, greater job security for our essential relievers and to fairly value and recognise teachers' work. Our union, NZEI Te Riu Roa, has scheduled online meetings to minimise disruption to teaching and learning and our school will aim to ensure the least disruption to your children's learning while upholding the right of teachers to participate in their union meeting.

COVID-19 continues to affect our students and staff this term. Please ensure you are informing the office if your child tests positive so that we are able to implement additional measures to reduce the likelihood of its spread. That is, extra cleaning, notification etc. It seems to be centred in the top block at present with two teachers absent due to COVID, and one or two cases in Room 4 (new entrants). Please ensure you keep your child home when they are ill, even if it's just a cold...while their immunity is down they are more likely to pick up other health issues like tummy bugs etc.

I would like to highlight some great learning around the school this week. Firstly, our teachers have recently completed professional observations in the teaching of Structured Literacy. This is deliberate and explicit teaching of the letters and the sounds they make in isolation and when put together. It was expected that our learners would take a while to excel as we had to work on backfilling gaps in knowledge created by teaching methods that are more broadly focused on sounding out words, looking at the pictures for clues, and comprehension of text. This method is still important, but should be introduced after the children have learned letter and sound concepts. Structured Literacy continues to go well and this week a Team 3 teacher has told me of a child who has progressed a massive amount of reading levels as everything suddenly clicked into place. These are the teaching moments educators live for! Please know that while your child might not bring home a book to read every night, we encourage you to share and enjoy literature with your child as often as you possibly can.

In Numeracy, the Board had approved a pilot of a Maths Knowledge programme in the top block for the duration of Term 2. We have a dedicated teacher aide who pops into each Topa classroom, meets with groups of students and gives them quick fire lessons in the area of maths knowledge that they are working at. Each level numerical stage is split further into A, B, C, D etc, and once the child has practised the skills in that level, they are given a mastery test to pass to see if they have retained the knowledge before they can go up to the next numerical level (e.g., 4D to 5A). You will likely see the knowledge practice sheets in your child's homework each week. They have 4 boxes on them, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday - due into the teacher on Friday. They are quick and easy to do. As parents, please feel free to help your child or to mark the work and give your child instant feedback on their progress. motivate them to work harder and faster to progress through the levels. At its midpoint, the pilot is going very well and our Year 5 & 6 learners are making really good progress and, even better, they are excited about their learning. Hopefully, the data from the pilot will be so great that we'll have all of the evidence required to fund this in the other teams too.

This year, in September, TAPS will be holding their triennial elections for our school Board. We hope to attract a diverse group of parents that have skills in a range of areas that support our school to be the best it can be as we make decisions that shape our children's future. If you have an interest in the Board, please put your name forward for nomination. If you have any questions, feel free to contact me to have a korero.

Finally, some sad news that will be a shock to many of you. After more than 15 years of teaching, forming lifelong connections and hard work at our kura, Maree Parkes has tendered her resignation as Teacher and Team Leader at TAPS. Maree has won a position at Kaitoke School on Great Barrier Island where her roots are and where her parents still reside. At the moment, we are working on replacing Maree's leadership positions and we don't have a clear idea of her end date as of yet. It is likely to be the end of term or soon after.
