We are sending this mini newsletter out as a way of sharing some need to know information for the next few weeks.

First, there will be a **Teachers Only Day on Friday 8th July - no school for students**. This is the last day of Term 2. During this time, teachers will be completing a full review of our planning and teaching systems, continuing (and hopefully concluding) the work we have been doing at our weekly staff meetings over the past few months. To reduce the stress load on parents, the school is operating a care programme for the day. For a full day (7am - 6pm) this will cost \$45 per child and for part-time hours (9am - 3pm) it will cost \$35. The caregivers will organise some engaging activities for the day and the students are allowed to be in non-uniform as it is not an official school day. Laille Martin (Before and After School Manager) will send out information and registration links early next week. We encourage other parents who don't wish to utilise this service to organise playdates with other friends, or just enjoy an extra day of holiday with their children.

To recognise Maree Parkes' dedication and service to TAPS for well over a decade, we will be having a special assembly on Thursday 7th July (the last school day of Term 2). Parents are welcome to attend.

If you missed the last newsletter, Maree has resigned as her husband and her are relocating to Great Barrier Island where Maree has won a teaching position at a local school. This will be a sad day for TAPS.

We are extremely proud of the way our tamariki have represented TAPS over the past few weeks. Two teams of four Year 5 and 6 boys participated in the EPRO 8 grand final. The Fluffy Avengers placed 5th equal and The United Unicorns Placed 8th equal. We have had a group of children planting our Trees for Survival seedlings on a local farm. Mrs White reports that the students worked extremely hard and planted well over 700 plants on Thursday. Tu Meke! Additionally, we had two teams representing TAPS at the Waikato Rippa Rugby tournament on Thursday as well. One of those teams coming second. Way to go team!

Illnesses

There are a number of very nasty illnesses hitting our children, particularly post-COVID. We've had reports of the genuine influenza (doctor diagnosed), strep throat, normal colds, gastro bugs and, most recently, a potential case of scarlet fever. Please, please keep your children home if they are not well. Even a little illness can make them susceptible to something far worse, requiring much more time off for everyone. We have four air purifiers rotating around the school as absences show us, sickness is more rife in a particular area. That coupled with clean environments, fresh air through ventilation, and good hand washing and sneeze etiquette, are our best defence for stopping the spread of these illnesses.


